After 30 years of continuous growth the Orange Regional Conservatorium is set to expand further. Our new home in the Orange Cultural Precinct will be a purpose-fit facility from which the whole community can experience the best in music education and performance.

With the construction costs funded by Federal, State and Local Government, it is now our task to bring to life the *Music Within*. The complete and high-quality fit-out of each studio, classroom and rehearsal space will provide future generations the opportunity to learn seamlessly, while the fit-out of the Recital Hall will guarantee audiences the most captivating experiences.

The purpose of the *Music Within* campaign is the complete fit-out of the new building, for which we aim to raise \$1.5 million.

A CONTINUING HISTORY of growth

30 years ago, in a rented school hall, the foundations of the Orange Regional Conservatorium were laid by a group of passionate parents, teachers and community musicians seeking high-quality music education in a regional town.

With the support of Orange City Council, the then Orange Music Association moved into a cottage, then the one next door and then to a former Brethren church, all the while growing and searching for room to expand.

Now, with over 1900 students, community ensemble members and students in schools' programs, the ORC has become a home for music education in the Central West of New South Wales. We attract world class musicians and educators and are becoming the regional venue of choice for many national and international touring artists.

The ORC provides a place for community music, while also reaching out into the region, and ensuring accessible, relevant and fun programs for all.

1990

With the support of Orange City Council, the then 'Orange Music Association' moves from a rented school hall to a permanent home in a small cottage, with several teaching studios. Soon followed by the installation of a demountable classroom for ensemble rehearsals.

1991

Growing demand allows the OMA to expand into the neighboring cottage, once again supported and facilitated by Orange City Council.

1993

A public push for a larger, dedicated home for the OMA begins as the organisation continues to grow.

1994

A new home is found in a former church, allowing the OMA to expand and have a dedicated performance space.

1995 - 2008

The ever growing OMA becomes the Orange Regional Conservatorium, operating over two campuses.

2009

The ORC consolidates onto the one site with the completion of nine new teaching studios.

2009 - 2015

The ORC continues to grow, expanding beyond the means of its retrofitted and ageing home.

2017

Orange City Council begins plans for a purpose-built Conservatorium Building to be the new home of the ORC.

2019

\$10 Million is committed from the Australian Federal Government towards the project

2020

\$5 Million is committed from Orange City Council towards the project

2021

A further \$5 million is committed from Orange City Council towards the project

2022

NSW Government contributes the remaining \$5 million for the project.



Construction begins



The ORC's role within the Orange community grows each year, not only with the number of lessons taught and concerts presented, but with the wide variety of services provided and opportunities offered.

The Conservatorium teaches weekly music programs in 21 local schools, including bands, choirs, lessons and syllabus aligned classes.

It is a resource for community groups such as the Orange Male Voice Choir, City of Orange Brass Band and Orange Symphony Orchestra, providing a venue for rehearsal and performance.

The ORC regularly hosts community groups for functions and events. It is the home of the City of Orange Eisteddfod and public school teachers professional development through Musica Viva Australia.

The ORC provides Orange with access to music events from national and international artists that are not often seen outside of major centres. At the core of this program is a commitment to accessibility and the provision of high quality affordable performances to the region that are relevant and engaging.


The new Conservatorium building will further expand its roles as a community resource, with more space for partnering organisations to use the facility for performance, education and enjoyment.

a new home

The new ORC building will double teaching and rehearsal space helping to meet growing demand. It will become a musical hub in Orange, bringing together local musicians, teachers and community groups to learn, experience and perform.

This facility will feature:

- Over 30 teaching studios
- Dedicated rehearsal studios
- Dedicated spaces for Early Childhood Music, Musicianship, Percussion, Recording and more.
- A 280-seat acoustically optimal Recital Hall

Position - Director and Principal

lan is the principal of Brewster Hjorth Architects. Established in 1984, he has built BHA into a firm recognised for design excellence of conceptual through to built work in the areas of urban design, masterplanning of community, sporting, civic, educational and heritage projects.

lan has a long association with the Orange area having designed the Orange School of Dentistry project in Orange for CSU in 2008 and the CSU/Joint Program of Medicine in Orange which opened in 2021. He is currently working on the Orange Sports Precinct project with NSW Public Works.

lan and his team have worked closely with ORC since the project's inception in 2017. Since then he has worked to keep the projects design functional and beautiful.

From the outset, lan has had a vision for natural light within all teaching spaces, something he saw as lacking in other similar facilities around the Country. This led to the 'triangular' design with a central courtyard that allows light into all the teaching, rehearsal, and public spaces internal to the building.

The ability to operate the Recital Hall and teaching facilities independently was another key design principle, resulting in a building in 'two-halves' that will allow the ORC to expand its business into exciting new areas.




